E. Out of State Travel-8th Grade Silverwood Science

- 4 Superintendent Dave Thennis told the Board that the 8th Grade Science wants to take a trip
- 5 to Silverwood in May. Sarah Daman, the Middle School science teacher, and student Adelaide
- 6 Meyer talked about the trip and the things the students would be doing to raise the money for the
- 7 trip and how important it would be to go to implement the things they have learned in science this
- 8 year. After questions and comments from the Board on the trip, finances, and transportation,

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F. MOU-Exception for 112.3 Retirement

- Superintendent Dave Thennis told the board Pam Johnson husband unexpectedly passed
- this fall and returning to work proved to be too difficult emotionally. She submitted her
- 16 resignation effective February 24, 2023. The timing of resignation would make her ineligible for a
- 17 sick leave payout because the collective bargaining agreement requires completing the contract.
- 18 Dave explained he worked with the STA to develop an MOU allowing eligibility for Pam
- 19 Johnson to receive her sick leave payout. Chairwoman Cathi Cook asked if the Board if they had
- any questions on the MOU presented. There were no questions or comments, and Stephanie Esch
- 21 made a motion to approve the MOU between the Stevensville School District and the Stevensville
- 22 Teachers Association creating a one-time exception to section 12.3 of the collective bargaining
- 23 agreement. Jennifer Gunterman seconded the motion. All voted aye.

G. High School Budget Recommendations

- Superintendent Dave Thennis told the Board that there was an increase in funding
- 26 from House Bill 15 that was signed the first week in March to provide support due to inflationary
- 27 increases. Dave told the Board that this presented a better picture than what was presented at the
- 28 work session in February, but stated we are outspending our general fund budget. Dave told the

Board he is still proposing the same reductions presented in February. After questions and 2 comments from the public and the Board on the High School Budget, Ben Meyer made a motion 3 to approve the budget recommendations as presented. Stephanie Esch seconded the motion. All voted aye. 4 5 H. Elementary School Budget Recommendations 6 Superintendent Dave Thennis told the Board that even with the extra funding 7 provided by HB15 for the elementary school it is still outspending our general budget. Dave told 8 the Board he is still proposing the same reductions presented in February. After questions and 9 comments from the public and the Board on the Elementary School Budget, Stephanie Esch made 10 a motion to approve the budget recommendations as presented. Tony Hudson seconded the 11 motion. Cathi Cook, Ben Meyer, Kris McKoy, Sean Lenahan, Billy Donaldson, Stephanie Esch, 12 and Tony Hudson voted aye. Jennifer Gunterman could not vote. 13 I. Operation Levy 14 Superintendent Dave Thennis told the board that the operational levy would provide relief to the strained elementary and high school budgets. Dave stated that he didn't 15 16 support running an operational levy this year, but felt the Board should consider it in 2024. At that 17 time, ESSER funds will be spent and discussions can take place about transitioning some ESSER funded staff into the general fund budget(s). After comments and questions from the Board on 18 19 the operational levy, Kris McKoy made a motion for the removal of an operational levy from the 20 resolution with Ravalli County and directed the District Clerk to notify Ravalli County of the 21 Boards intent to remove the operational levy from the May 2, 2023, ballot. Tony Hudson 22. seconded the motion. All voted aye. 23 J. Senate Bill 307 Resolution to Impose Levies 24 i. Elementary 2.5 ii. High School 26 Superintendent Dave Thennis told the Board they need to approve Senate Bill 307 that 27 shows any increases or decreases to the district mills for next year. Dave went over the increases

and decreases in the Elementary and High School levies. Chairwoman Cathi Cook asked the

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- 1 Board if they had any questions or comments on the Elementary resolution for Senate Bill 307 as
- 2 presented. Ben Meyer made a motion to adopt the Resolution of Intent to impose an increase in
- 3 permissive levies in the Elementary District as presented. Tony Hudson seconded the motion.
- 4 Cathi Cook, Ben Meyer, Kris McKoy, Sean Lenahan, Billy Donaldson, Stephanie Esch, and Tony
- 5 Hudson voted aye. Jennifer Gunterman could not vote.
- 6 Cathi asked the Board if they had any questions or comments on the High School
- 7 resolution for Senate Bill 307 as presents. Jennifer Gunterman made a motion to adopt the
- 8 Resolution of Intent to impose an increase in permissive levies for the High School District as
- 9 presented. Stephanie Esch seconded the motion. All voted aye.

- 26 will allow for some work-experience opportunities.
